Future continuous

- Future continuous puts emphasis on the course of an action taking place in the future.
- **Form**
 - A: He will be talking.
 - N: He will not be talking.
 - Q: Will he be talking?
- **Use**
- action that is going on at a certain time in the future
- action that is sure to happen in the near future
- **Signal Words**
- in one year, next week, tomorrow
- Exercise on future continuous

Future perfect

- Future perfect expresses an action that will be finished at a certain time in the future.
- **Form**
 - A: He will have talked.
 - N: He will not have talked.
 - Q: Will he have talked?
- **Use**
- action that will be finished at a certain time in the future
- **Signal Words**
- by Monday, in a week

Future perfect continuous

- Future perfect continuous puts emphasis on the course / duration of an action taking place before a certain time in the future. It can also be used to express an assumption regarding a future action.
- Future perfect continuous is not used very often as it can usually be replaced by future perfect.
- **Form**
 - A: He will have been talking.
 - N: He will not have been talking.
 - Q: Will he have been talking?
- **Use**
- action taking place before a certain time in the future
- puts emphasis on the course of an action
- **Signal Words**
- for ..., the last couple of hours, all day long
